



Standing with Families to Protect the Rights of Immigrants Families

Shaker Heights has a long history of promoting and valuing diversity back to the 1960's. Then, the community intentionally sought to integrate Ludlow School as a student body and community of multiracial members. Our schools value multiple perspectives that add to our understanding, knowledge, and contributions to our community.

Today, we are at a crossroads. The policies of the new presidential administration focusing on the mass deportation of immigrants threaten many contributing diverse members, families, and students in our communities.

The international student population's safety and well-being are vulnerable to the unethical and racial discrimination taking place across the country as a result of the new presidential administration's practices around immigration. I.C.E. agents are now targeting cities and school districts with large populations of Latino and other ethnic minorities, attempting to gain entry into school buildings to investigate and identify children of immigrant families. Federal law ensures all children regardless of immigrant status have the right to free public education. The district has stated, "It is committed to providing a safe, welcoming, and inclusive school environment for all students, regardless of their immigration status. To that end, we will follow school safety protocols, District policy, and state and federal laws, which provide guidance on who is allowed to contact students during the school day."

We have students and families impacted by the president's policies on immigration and mass deportation. The current policies devalue the contributions of our families of immigrants. Each of our students, mothers, and fathers are persons of value. They are living in fear and anxiety about their tenuous ability to provide for their families and live in our community. **Now is the time to stand up for them.**
